

FAQs

1) Is this program going away?

No. We anticipate receiving additional funding from the Treasury department to continue funding the program. The pause is allowing the team to transition to the second round of funding.

2) Why is there a pause?

The original source of funds for the CRUA program was tied to funding legislation from the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 which was enacted on December 27th 2020. The County's share of funding for the CRUA program to help with rent and utilities was \$19.8M which has been fully spent, or obligated.

3) What will happen to my application I just submitted?

If you have applied before March 25th 2022, your application will be reviewed and funded as normal.

4) I applied a while ago, does this mean I can't get any more funds?

No. If you are already in our system, we will continue to reach out to you as you are eligible to recertify. We are not able to pay for the benefit month of May at this time, but we can process your recertification request and be ready to fund in May if approved.

5) Will there be any changes to the program after the pause?

Yes, there will be small changes. As the funding source changes, the legislation is tweaked. While the program largely remains the same, certain guidelines will be updated. We will send revised FAQs on the upcoming program changes.

6) Do I need to reapply?

No. We have your information and will continue to preserve that as the program moves forward with the new funding source.
